South Shore returns to High Point Market

Takes showroom in C&D Building

AT THE MARKET — After a nine-year absence, Canadian ready-to-assemble resource South Shore Furniture is returning to the High Point Market this week with a new showroom on the seventh floor of the C&D Building.

The main reason for the move is the increasing importance of e-commerce, a channel South Shore has cultivated while showing at Las Vegas Market the past seven years, the company said.

“It was an important decision for us, but not an easy one,” said Jean Laflamme, CEO of South

Shore. “High Point Market has seriously repositioned itself. E-commerce wasn’t a big topic, given the reality of traditional brick-and-mortar retailers, when South Shore Furniture left in 2007. In the omnichannel Millennials era, where the consumer is in the driver’s seat, now more than ever, traditional retailers are ready to integrate and consider the e-commerce reality more seriously. Our move to High Point means we are offering new, progressive solutions to the traditional retail business.”

South Shore counts itself a key

supplier to major e-retailers and adapts its model to both global and smaller, specialized retail players, he said.

“We decided to focus more closely on the end consumer,” Laflamme said. “We underwent a serious transformation. A better understanding of the Internet furniture and decor shopper, while focusing the whole organization on the end consumer, made us a more agile and knowledgeable consultant for our business partners. There’s a transparency and speed to e-commerce that propelled us as a company.”

South Shore has invested heavily in its new showroom, which reflects the company’s concentration on e-commerce specialist. Technology is an important part of the showroom and, since furniture icon Ikea recently launched its first

virtual reality experience in the Kitchens category, South Shore is eager to share its own augmented reality experience with its partners.

South Shore said it is returning to High Point to discuss its model with a broader customer base.

The company will offer more than 20 new, creative and affordable collections, ranging from the trendy Modern Farmhouse style to classic Coastal Chic.

AT THE MARKET— Conarte, an Italian manufacturer of solid oak case goods, makes its High Point Market debut this week as Conarte America in partnership with High Point-based Minick Wood Products, its exclusive distributor in the United States and Canada.

Conarte America by Minick Wood is showing at Minick’s home warehouse in High Point, 827 W. Green Dr. Minick has converted the old factory building of Hayworth Roll & Panel into an industrial-atmosphere showroom.

Conarte manufactures its 100% solid oak goods, with woods sourced mostly from France, in Veneto, Italy. The line already has developed a higher-end clientele, particularly among designers, according to the company.

Minick Wood Products specializes in environmentally responsible solid wood furniture that avoids the use of formaldehyde. According to the company website, all furniture is boxed and shipped in strong cartons made from recycled materials.
